Physical Education

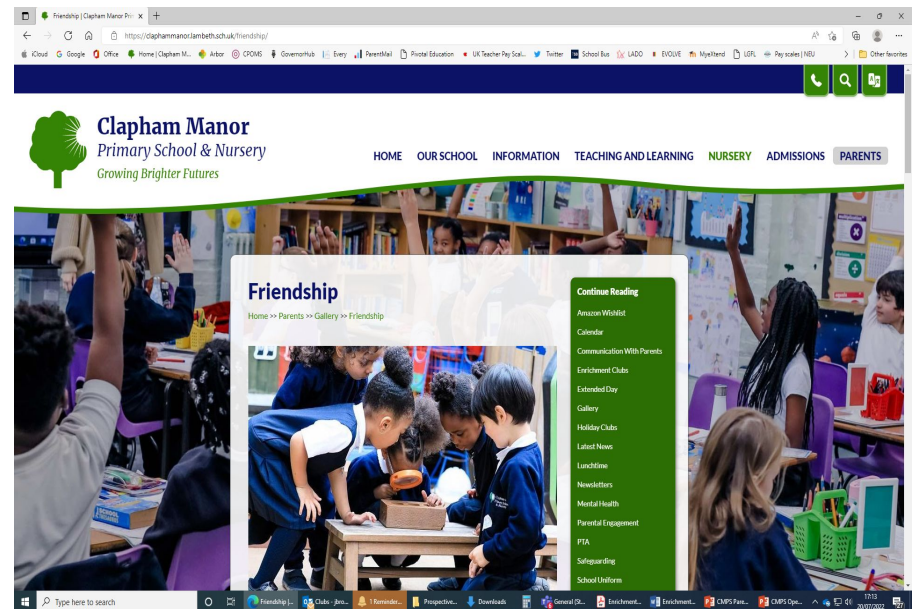
- Our PE days are Thursdays and Fridays. (This half term it will be football and hockey)
- On Fridays, PE will be lead by a PE coach.
- Children must wear their school PE kit on the days they are having PE lessons.
- You will be contacted if your child is not wearing full PE kits as PE kit is considered part of school uniform.
- Parents will need to bring the required PE to school for their child if they do not arrive at school in PE kit.

Trips

Photograph consent form

- Photographs can only be taken and shared with parents consent.
- If parents indicate 'no photographs' to be taken/shared of child, then they won't.
- However, please carefully consider this.
- This will include:

 - Group photographs in plays/nativity
 - Gift CD / year books
 - Sports team photographs
- This also includes photos for any of our social media platforms that we use to share and celebrate the work the children do in school.



Parents support/volunteers

- We value the offer of support from parents in any way.
- Parents have supported in hearing children read, during art activities, volunteers in classrooms, school trips, whole school events, library, changing for swimming etc.
- All parent volunteers need to be DBS (Disclosure Barring Service) checked to ensure safe to work with children.
- All volunteers to have safeguarding for volunteers training before they start volunteering in school.

Parents support/volunteers

- We ask that parents offer to support the school but not their child.
- Parent helpers will be deployed to support where the need is. Parents may not always be deployed to support in the same class as their child.
- If you would like to support the school by purchasing equipment and resources, you are able to access year group wish lists and make orders directly to class teacher. Please note, this is not an expectation of parents / carers to do.

Assessments

- Across Years 2 - 6, all children are assessed in Maths, Reading & Writing at the of the Autumn, Spring and Summer terms.
- Assessments help us track progress, identify trends and analyse gaps in learning so we can adjust planning to best support children's needs.
- Assessments only provide a part of your child's learning journey. When we report to parents, we provide our 'teacher judgement'; taking into account all the evidence demonstrated on a daily basis in lessons as well.

Assessments

- Over the course of Year 6, the children will complete many past SATs papers as well as other tests as relevant to help us track their progress, identify and address areas of weakness and prepare them for the actual SATs tests.
- We complete a baseline test at the beginning of the year to establish starting points.
- Subsequently, testing will generally occur at the end of each half term.
- As we approach the SATs, we increase children's exposure to SATs style questions to help them to feel more comfortable with them.
- SATs in 2024 will be the week beginning Monday 13th May.

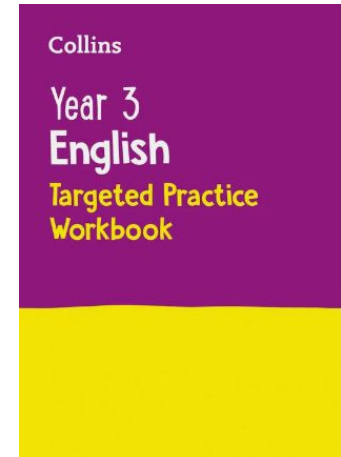
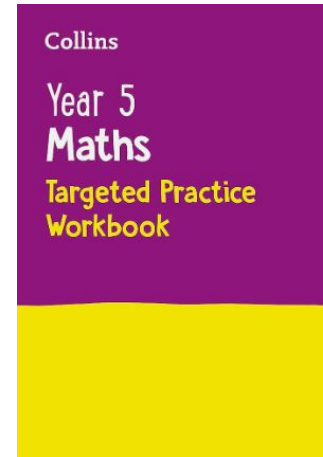
Communication about your child's progress and education

Home Learning

- Home Learning will be set weekly every Friday and collected in the following Thursday.
- We will continue to use Collins Targeted Practice Workbooks for English and Maths.
- Daily Fluency Practice must take place across TTRS, Reading and Spelling.
- Reading will be tracked using Accelerated Reader.
- Optional 'Half Termly Projects' are also set where we encourage children to make one project relating to a topic they are being taught over that half term.
- Year 6 have additional Maths and English weekly homework on SATs companion (which they should have got logins for at the end of last year)

Contacting a member of staff

- We value face to face communication and ensure that class teachers are available before and after school.
- Although staff can be contacted by email, we ask that you are mindful of our teachers staff workload, as such we will operate an email window between 7am and 7pm, Monday to Friday; emails will not be reviewed outside of these times.
- Our school's policy is to respond to all emails, where possible, within 3 working days.

What your child will need

- Book bag with reading book, homework book & a named water bottle.
- Appropriate additional clothing, suitable for the weather (i.e. coat, hat, gloves).
- If it is necessary for your child to have a phone, these need to be handed in to a member of staff on the gate in the morning.
- At break, children can have a healthy snack (no biscuits, sweets or crisps).
- We are a nut free school - ensure these are not included as snacks or packed lunch.
- Please ensure your child does not bring in any toys, stationary or personal items. It's important we are consistent across the whole school. If you feel your child needs something to help with their learning, this must be approved by Miss Williams first.
